The Level 5 Diploma in Leadership and Management for Adult Care is aimed at leaders and managers in adult care in a range of adult care settings, such as: residential services for older people and people with disabilities, domiciliary care services, day services, respite services and community based services.

The qualification can be used both within and outside of an Apprenticeship standard for those learners who work in Adult Care in England, in the following roles: Registered Managers and Managers.

The qualification may also be used to support Assistant Managers and Deputy Managers providing you are able to demonstrate the knowledge and skills at Level 5 and your job role allows you to be able to demonstrate the required skills in real work activities

How we deliver this qualification

This qualification is delivered on a one to one, or remote, basis by your own dedicated expert Health and Social Care Tutor.

They will meet with you every month (face to face or virtually) to provide teaching and training to help you develop new knowledge and skills and guide you through the programme.

They will then assess your competence by observing you applying the new skills at work and helping you develop a portfolio of evidence to prove you have met the requirements of the qualification.
