

The Level 4 Diploma in Adult Care is an occupational qualification for learners who work in adult care settings in a team leader/senior role. This qualification is the natural next step for those who have completed a Level 3 Diploma and applies to a variety of roles, where you have key responsibilities for delivery of care and support and/or a level of supervisory responsibility for others, such as; Lead Adult Care Worker, Lead Personal Assistant, Senior Care Assistant and Support Worker, Team Leaders.

How we deliver this qualification

This qualification is delivered on a one to one, or remote, basis by your own dedicated expert Health and Social Care Tutor.

They will meet with you every month (face to face or virtually) to provide teaching and training to help you develop new knowledge and skills and guide you through the programme.

They will then assess your competence by observing you applying the new skills at work and helping you develop a portfolio of evidence to prove you have met the requirements of the qualification.
